



New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Financing Program S34-640-34-B

Construction of upgrades and improvements to CCMUA's manholes and interceptor system, located in the township of Cherry Hill with a capital cost of \$4,586,860 were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (NJIB) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the NJIB to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

This project will provide water quality benefits by increasing efficiency and extending the life of the existing manholes and collection system which will benefit residents and businesses in Cherry Hill Township.

State Revolving Fund programs around the nation provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure protecting our valuable water resources nationwide.
