

NEW JERSEY ENVIRONMENTAL INFRASTRUCTURE FINANCING PROGRAM PROJECT No. S340640-32

Construction of the CCMUA-Camden-Pennsauken CSO Disconnect project, \$26,115,025.34 were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (NJIB) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the NJIB to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

This project will provide water quality benefits by separating the current combined stormwater and sanitary sewer system in the western section of Pennsauken Township into dedicated storm sewer and sanitary sewer lines, improving water quality and mitigating localized flooding for residents and businesses in Camden County.

State Revolving Fund programs around the nation provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure protecting our valuable water resources nationwide.
