The Circuit is a network of bicycle and pedestrian trails connecting people to jobs, communities and parks in the Greater Philadelphia Region. New trails are added each year.

#### FUN FACTS ABOUT THE CIRCUIT TRAILS:

- More than 374 miles of trail are open for use today! When completed, the Circuit will have more than 800 miles of trail, with 50% of the region's population living within one mile of the trail network.
- Camden has many miles of trails-some right in your backyard! Trail segments include: Gloucester Light Rail w/ trail, Cooper River Trail, Camden Greenways, Delaware River Heritage Trail, and the Merchantville Trail.
